Sunday 8th - Saturday 14th August 2010

The Daily Programme

There is an outline daily programme on our website for you to look at (www.gamusic.co.uk). There are a number of music sessions (technique, chamber, orchestra, etc.) each day with the course tutors, interspersed with opportunities for fun and relaxation to suit all students organised by the Welfare team, including possible excursions to local places of interest/activity. At the end of each day – and considered one of the highlights of the courses - is the popular 'after cocoa session' where students and staff put on impromptu performances!

Where to come to

Beauchamp House, Churcham, Glos. GL2 8AA. Beauchamp House is approximately 3 miles west of Gloucester on the A40. Coming from Gloucester, west on the A40, follow the dual carriageway until you get to a roundabout where the A48 splits off to the left for Chepstow. Continue on the A40 for about another half a mile; when you get to woods both sides of the road, start looking out for Beauchamp House (also signed 'School of the Lion') on the left hand side. If you get to Churcham Garage you have gone too far! When you turn into the drive, please be aware of other students and their families as you find a parking space.

What time to come

Please arrive between 3.30 and 5.00 p.m. on 8th August to register with the Welfare staff and find out where to pitch your tent. The Welfare staff will normally suggest that young students, particularly those not sharing a tent, pitch theirs close together – and close to one of the Welfare tents. If anyone wants to share a tent, please discuss this on arrival with the Welfare team who should be able to team you up with someone or contact Anne Ingram to sort out in advance. At 5.00 p.m. there is a welcome / introductory talk by the course Director and the Welfare team. Refreshments will be available on arrival.

Welfare Team

The Welfare Team look after students when they are not in rehearsals. The team members for this week are Richard Phillips, Emily Smith, Elsie Kenny and Tom Kenny.

Dietary Needs

The Health Form asks for details of any special dietary requirements. Our catering team do try hard to accommodate all our students' needs but need a minimum of two weeks written notice to do this. If you have very strict dietary needs, like a gluten free diet, we would find it helpful if you could provide some of the basic ingredients you use, eg. flour and pasta.

Medicines

Please give any medicines (clearly labelled and with full instructions) to a member of the Welfare team on arrival.

What to bring

- ♪ A cake that keeps well – an essential ingredient for 'after cocoa sessions'!
- ♪ A tent, sleeping bag, lilo/camp bed, torch and any other items necessary for a week under canvas. No penknives please!
- ♪ Towels and toiletries
- ♪ Casual clothes, nightclothes, underwear, etc.
- ♪ Waterproof outdoor wear, swimming kit for water games etc. Flip-flops, wellies etc. are always useful in the unfortunate event of rain!
- ♪ Sun protection (hopefully sunny weather), including a hat.
- ♪ We don't ask anyone to bring formal clothes although some students (not all by any means) like to have something smarter to wear for the concerts.
- ♪ Pencil, sharpener and rubber
- ♪ Instrument!
- ♪ Anything needed, eg. music, for performing at 'after-cocoa session' - optional

Please label everything clearly! We don't accept any liability for losses or breakages.

Insurance

The Gloucester Academy of Music's insurance does not cover instruments and valuables brought to the courses – these need to be covered on your own insurance. The instruments are locked up overnight.

Pocket money

It is suggested that students bring about £30 of pocket money to cover trips out, etc. (coach travel is included in the course fee). The Welfare staff collect £20 at the beginning of the week for this purpose and the rest is then available for students to spend on tuck should they wish to. (The Tuck Shop is run by the catering staff – open at morning and afternoon break-times.) We recommend that younger children deposit all their money with the Welfare staff. Any remaining pocket money is returned prior to departure.

Mobile phones

We suggest that all mobile phones are handed in to the Welfare team on arrival for safe-keeping – and then used on request. If you consider this inappropriate, then please ensure that your child understands that he/she is responsible for it and that it **MUST** be switched off during rehearsals *and* at night. This way we avoid disruption of rehearsals and inter-tent texting at night. We strongly encourage any younger children to hand in their mobile phones to the welfare team and to phone home between 6.00-7.00 p.m. rather than at bedtime. *If your child is bringing a mobile phone, please make sure they bring their own charger.*
